

# Reflections

Shortly after his arrival to community, I was able to sit down (over Zoom, of course) with Kevin, one of the Jesuit Novices who joined us for a few months. Over the course of our Zoom call, we were able to touch on everything from where Kevin grew up (Virginia), to why pizza is the best food (you can put anything on it), to his favorite hat (the flat cap; ask him to elaborate on that story). Though I will not be able to share everything we discussed, I've rounded up some meaningful takeaways from our conversation.

Early on, Kevin shared about his love of math and physics. Kevin studied these subjects at the University of Virginia, and throughout our conversation his appreciation for these topics was clear. When I prodded on why one might feel so deeply connected to these things, he shared that he found beauty in the simplicity of numbers. Though his answer pertained to the subjects he studied, his appreciation for the beauty and simplicity of the ordinary rang true as we talked more. From effortlessly describing the magic of putting two numbers together to graciously stepping into the L'Arche community, Kevin demonstrated a deep ability to see the beauty in everyday occurrences.


After four years of college, Kevin served as a Jesuit Volunteer (JV) for a year, like many members of our L'Arche community. Kevin mentioned that he felt drawn to this service as he had spent 21 years of life studying God's creation through school, but wanted to spend part of life serving God's people and connecting with them. He served at a Jesuit Catholic Parish in East Los Angeles as the Youth Ministry Coordinator. When his year as a JV ended, he entered the Jesuits. As a Jesuit Novice, he has been a volunteer chaplain at a hospital, activities assistant at a skilled nursing facility, and small group leader for a virtual prayer series. We are so grateful for his time serving and connecting with us here at L'Arche.

To finish things off, Kevin shared a bit on what he was looking forward to as he joined us in community here. He mentioned looking forward to the unknown experiences to come and he observed, "There is a lot of love in this community. I have been thinking about this a lot—what I am here for, why I am here...To experience the love and generosity that is here".
